We are considering upgrades to a number of existing roads to bring them up to urban standards, and a range of new connections.

Many of these were identified in the Supporting Growth Preferred Transport Network (2016), however we are also looking at a range of additional options we would like your feedback on:

- New and upgraded arterial connections (this Poster)
- New and upgraded east-west connections under or over the Northern Motorway (SH1) (Poster 2).

These corridors will accommodate walking, cycling and public transport. Safety improvements will also be an important consideration as well as planting and new stormwater treatments. We're seeking your feedback on these options.
